Grow in Grace and Knowledge

Each Sunday in 2022, God's word was proclaimed clearly and boldly. Whether it was our morning sermons, our evening Discovery Bible Studies, or our weekly articles, lessons coming from the Old and New Testament alike equipped us to be more like Jesus and to share Him with others. Designed to align with 1 Peter 5:10, our lesson series in 2022 included Esther's Missing God: Seeing Him in Dark Times, Come to the Table, Praise and Harmony, This is Jesus, Rest and Restoration, Confirmed: Living by God's Word, Stronger, Firm Foundation, Jonah, Enter with Thanksgiving, and Be Thou My Vision.

We didn't stop there. We continued publishing **Daily Devotionals** as videos on Facebook and podcasts on our church website every Monday through Friday. The **New Life Series** and **GROW** equipped us to live out our faith as Christians, while **Words of Life** improved our Bible study and **Worship with Reverence and Awe** deepened our worship. Our current series, **Knowing Jesus**, is taking us through the Gospel of Mark. Along with our Sunday sermons, Bible studies, and articles, this daily proclamation of God's Word helped drive **5,389 visits to our church website** and **reached over 36,307 Facebook users** here and around the world.

John Harrison, Jay McClary, and Gary McIntyre took turns leading the small group Bible study meeting in our Fellowship Hall through wide ranging topics such as Esther, Amos, Death and Resurrection, Come Let Us Reason Together, and Angels. At the same time, a small group met on Zoom and in the Teen Room for a Family Discovery Bible Study that brought children and adults together for an intergenerational time of study and prayer. Together they discovered The Source, Courage and Conviction, and how to pray from Lord Teach Us to Pray, Praying like Jesus, Devoted to Prayer, and Making My Prayer. On Thursday evenings at Georgetown Family Medicine, Luis Chastain led a growing group of men from our congregation and the community through Titus and then through a Discovery Bible Study of The Gospel of Luke. Through our Ladies Fellowship, Debbie Jordan concluded **Sisters at Sea** before passing the torch to Ashley Hager to lead **Impossible**, a study of the Gospel of Luke. Debbie Justice also arranged for us to join the Seneca congregation's **"Be a Blessing" Ladies Day** virtually, during which we donated items to the Family Justice Center locally and our congregation's young men served lunch.

In 2022, we **gave ourselves** in prayer and fasting and through **over \$60,000** in contributions to **advance God's kingdom...**

Not only did our **COVID Care Packages** get put to use again in early 2022, but they morphed into **Compassion Kits** produced by our Teen class for us to share essential items and a verse card with people in need. Likewise, our **Food Teams** - which always bless our members recovering from illness, mourning losses, or welcoming new children with delicious homecooked meals - shared the gospel as they fed Habitat for Humanity volunteers and the Georgetown High football team.



Our strong presence at Georgetown's observance of the National Day of Prayer was felt as we all wore the new church t-shirts Melody Skipper designed for us. The message on the back - "Go Make Disciples" from Matthew 28:18-20 - describes so many of our activities throughout the year. We gave two different Fellowship of Christian Athletes devotionals to the Georgetown High School football team to help start and end their season. We passed out candy, verse cards, and comic books with stories from Acts to 150 Trick-or-Treaters in Kensington. We packed the pulpit with 622 lbs. of Thanksgiving groceries for our neighbors in need, and then joyfully served, prayed, and even sang God's praise together in Helping Hands' warehouse the next day. We closed the year caroling and passing out treats and verse cards at Prince George Healthcare Center.



Let the Children Come

Our youth are a vital part of everything we do - and then there are the things we do just for them. Graciously hosted at the Molesworths' home, our **Dino Devo** in August was a creative, fun, and faith-building event. Great fellowship was shared through **Trunk or Treat** in October and the **Teen Progressive Dinner** in December. Whether it's our **Sunday evening classes**, **Primary Praise** for our K4 through 5th grade students to learn Bible and Music, the **teen girls devotionals** hosted by Nia Valentin and Mala Lee, or the **teen boys discipling** with Dan Hager, our young people have so many opportunities to joyfully grow.
